New Bible Study



Stephen Ministry News

My name is Sue Ellen Campbell. I grew up in a small rural area of Ohio. I was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Minerva, Ohio. My church had a youth class on Sunday evenings. I was fortunate to have two Christian leaders who guided me through my teenage years with wisdom, encouragement and love. During the summers of my junior and senior year of high school, I was the church secretary. That was a challenge and an eye opening responsibility of keeping the pastoral office running smoothly and efficiently while maintaining a sense of humor which, at times, was trying. I know the experience I felt influenced my thinking of how I could help others that were less fortunate.

I was commissioned as a Stephen Minister through First Congregational Church in Akron in 2009. I prayed and listened with the women to help them find inner peace from a loss, sickness, accident or any misfortune in their life, and in 2010 completed and was commissioned as a Christ Care Series group leader through Stephen Ministries. First Congregational Church offered me the opportunity to start a program to help battered women and their children. My life changed dramatically as I observed, week after week, their excitement about their new independence as we worked together as a group to bring back the feeling of self-worth, independence and God's plan for them and their children. I called it a new lease on life, under my breath, as all of them enriched my life with laughter, their street smarts, forgiveness and God's love. Being a Stephen Minister is a wonderful opportunity to help others with God's help.

Psalm 100 was the prayer we prayed together before ending our meetings.

- 1. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands.
- 2. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing.
- 3. Know ye that the Lord he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.
- 4. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name.
- 5. For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations.

Thank you Stephen Ministry Leaders/PUMC for selecting me to attend the Leaders Training Conference (LTC) in Orlando this past January 8-14th. As one of 250 plus participants from 44 states, I was fortunate to have a North Carolina Pastor as a prayer partner for the week and was one of 8 amazing caring and giving Christians at table #3 (See picture).

What is A Stephen Minister:

Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations that use the Stephen Series system. Stephen Ministry is built to last—going strong for over 20 or even 30 years in hundreds of congregations.

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Humble Beginnings of Stephens Ministry:

Stephen Ministers was founded by a young, well educated and broke ordained minister/clinical psychologist with a PHD. Kenneth Haugks' modest beginnings in a single bedroom apartment with his wife and newborn daughter began with a grant. Today Dr Haugk is widower after his wife's' long battle with cancer having experienced first hand the painful realities life throws at us.

Today and Scope of this Incredible Training:

- More than 12,000 congregations have enrolled in the Stephen Series.
- More than 70,000 pastors and lay leaders from those congregations have been equipped at Leader's Training Courses.
- More than 600,000 laypeople have received Stephen Minister training.
- More than one-and-a-half-million people have had a Stephen Minister to walk with them, providing one-to-one Christian care during tough times.

What went on that week:

A staff of 25 from the Stephen Ministers headquarters in St Louis meticulously delivered probably the best training this financial adviser has ever experienced in 30 years of practice. I participated in workshops, roleplaying, work luncheons and dinners that on 3/7 days started at 8am and ended at 9pm. I learned the very detailed system that has quietly and caringly, since 1975, delivered care-giving to over a half million "care receivers" or "people hurting" from life's realities (sickness, tragedies, unemployment, financial concerns, health issues and much more).

What Now:

My very moving experience at the LTC Conference has equipped me, and thus our congregations Leaders and Stephen Ministers with a "Teaching System and Tools" to assist Pastor Chris in "prayerfully caring" for our members and non-members in our growing community.

If you experience a friend or a family member that feels sadness or altered emotions or feels alone, please call our church. This care is entirely confidential—no one knows the identity of a care receiver except for his or her Stephen Minister and the pastor or Stephen Leader who paired the two together.

Thank You Parrish United Methodist Church, God has forever left his loving and caring "print' on me.





Financial News . . .

2016 Financial Summary

During 2016, our church received contributions to the General Operating Fund (01) in the amount of \$553,212 which was approximately \$11,000 over the budgeted amount of \$542,296 and nearly \$18,000 over the previous year contributions total. Our expenses totaled \$540,202 which was \$7,700 under the budgeted expectation of \$547,958. The combination of these two items resulted in a surplus in the General Operating Fund of approximately \$20,000. The surplus was distributed among existing reserves and a new Roof Reserve was created to fund the replacement of the current building's roof in the future.

The Building Fund (02) received \$25,119 in congregational contributions, \$89,000 from the PUMC Thrift Cottage contributions, \$16,604 from the 3% giving from the General Operating Fund and approximately \$4,500 from other miscellaneous sources. The total income to the Building Fund was approximately \$136,000.

The Scrip Fund (05) has a 'distributable balance' of \$3,271.06 as of the year-end. The Administrative Ministry Team voted to contribute 50% of this total to assist with funding for the 2017 Ecuador mission trip and 50% was moved to the Building Fund.

United Methodist Foundation Deposits

At the end of December, the church has \$445,172 on deposit at the UM Foundation. This amount is on deposit across three accounts, two participation accounts and one investment account. The funds are restricted as follows:

Other Reserves

In addition to restricted funds held at the UM Foundation the church has \$35,043 in other restricted funds on deposit with the local bank. Included in this total is an additional \$8,292 in Operating Reserves. Also, on deposit at the church's local bank is an additional \$28,423 in permanently restricted Building Funds. As a rule, when this balance exceeds \$50,000 it is transferred to the UM Foundation.

Thank you for your continued financial support of our church. The Administrative Ministry Team is working diligently to ensure that we have adequate funding for the future growth of our church and the ministries we support in our community.
